Winnie is 95, and lives alone in LaFargeville, New York. LaFargeville is just a little town between Watertown and Alexandria Bay. Marty graduated from LaFargeville High School, in her class of 22 students.

You see, Winnie remembered a gentleman that years ago, lived in town, and would often go for walks. He spent some time with Marty's Dad, Carl. The man's name was Hurley, and his grandson is Doug Hurley, who is a pilot for the SpaceX.

We found the station that was showing the launch on the TV. We watched Doug Hurley, whose father grew up in LaFargeville ready himself for take-off. I quietly cheered for him, as he gave the thumbs up just seconds before take-off. I watched as the rockets started, and the SpaceX started to slowly climb and gain speed until he was traveling thousands of miles an hour and entered into orbit.

Missions:

Hello everyone! A few words about missions at West Barre. Even through this time, the soup kitchen that we help with in Albion, has been marching on. They are serving meals in take-out containers for people to take home, plus a bag of items to take home.

We took a meal of goulash, beans, bread and butter, last Friday, the 29th. We were prepared with 250 meals and we served around 185. Everyone is very appreciative of the meals and the extra bag they received.

The people that run the soup kitchen are there almost every day. If they aren't helping someone there, they are out gathering food items from their various locations, going into Rochester for some of it. There are many stores and individuals that help with the supply chain at the soup kitchen.

If you are interested, they could use help on Friday nights sometimes. We can give you the number for the lady, Faith, that runs the kitchen and she can tell you if they need help.

Now, we are moving on to the monthly mission for June, which is the Church World Service blanket drive. Each \$5 we receive will buy a wool blanket that can help someone in need, whether it is a homeless person, a family that is without anything because of a fire or other disaster, or a teen that has lost their way. Last year, we sent over \$700 for this mission. I hope to do that or better this year!

Some have questioned why we do missions across the world, why not just take care of the ones around us.

Well, with this pandemic, we have learned just how small the world is. There is need everywhere and in every town or village.


The West Barre Church offers you many opportunities to help with a mission.
