

From Our Pastor

I had been asked last month to write a short article introducing myself to the congregation and telling you a little bit about Kim and myself. This passage of scripture from 1 Peter 5:2-5 describes what is most important to us when I think of the months ahead when Kim and I will be worshipping with you and serving as your pastors.

Just as shepherds watch over their sheep, you must watch over everyone God has placed in your care. Do it willingly in order to please God, and not simply because you think you must. Ladies Lenten Bible Study Group!

Hi! I'm Kim Heiler, Pastor Jim's wife, and I am interested in leading a Ladies' Lenten Bible Study group via Zoom (easy to use!) on Monday evenings, 5:30 – 6:30 pm. We would begin on Monday, February 22nd (with a 'test' Zoom meeting on Monday, February 15th at 5:30 pm). We will be using the daily devotional book "Pauses for Lent: 40 Days" by Trevor Hudson, and the cost of the book will be covered for you by the Worship Fund Budget (the book is \$9). Each day of Lent, the book has us focus and think about a single word and how that word is relevant to our time of Lent and the coming of the Easter Season. Each day has a short scripture passage, a paragraph of reflection, and then a suggestion for a daily practice. We would start reading the book on Day 1 on the first day of Lent (Wed., Feb. 17th), one page per day, throughout the 40 days of Lent. Our Zoom Devotional meetings would be each Monday evening during Lent at 5:30 pm. We'll have 6 Monday meetings during the Lenten season.

During each meeting, we would be able to talk about the book and what especially interested each of us during the week's readings. We could share and support each other and end with a prayer time. The general goal of the Bible study is to help us understand the value of the Lenten season and prepare ourselves for the joy of Easter.

Zoom is easy to use. There are three options: by telephone (hear and listen), by smart phone (hear, listen and see), and by computer/tablet (hear, listen and see). Thus, you do not need a tablet or computer to participate – your regular telephone will work just fine! On Monday, Feb. 15th, we'll have a 'test' meeting where you can practice getting onto a Zoom meeting. You will receive an email each week ahead of time (for smart phones and computer/tablet users) that has a link to the meeting. If you are calling in by telephone, you dial a telephone number and then enter the meeting number.

If you would like to participate in the Ladies' Lenten Bible Study group, please give your name, email address (if you have one) and your phone number to Lanor. Lanor will order the books and distribute them to you. I will coordinate setting up the Zoom meetings and answering your question about how to get into the Zoom meeting.


