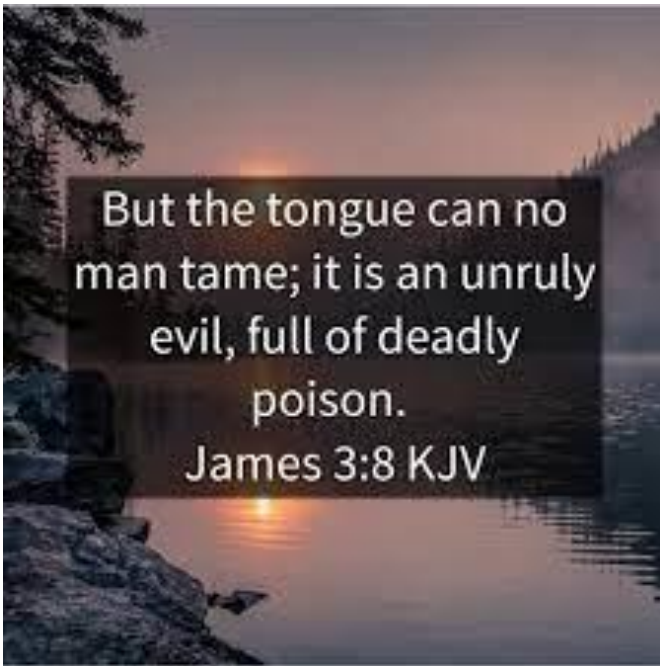

Anyone who would like to place flowers on the altar, or sponsor flowers you are asked to let Naomi (590-4380) or Lanor (208-1965) know.




