VANILLA MUFFINS

Nonstick cooking spray for the muffin tins

4 cups all-purpose flour 1 tablespoon baking powder

2 cups granulated sugar

½ teaspoon salt 2 cups milk

2 large eggs, lightly beaten

½ cup unsalted butter, melted

1 tablespoon vanilla extract



Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.

Coat several mini-muffin tins with nonstick cooking spray and set aside.

Sift the flour, baking powder, sugar and salt into a large bowl.

In a separate large bowl, whisk together the milk, eggs, butter and vanilla.

Add the wet ingredients to the dry and stir until just combined.

Spoon the batter into the muffin tins and bake for 15 to 20 minutes or until browned on top.
