

Where did the summer go? We had a great summer and anticipate a wonderful fall.

Besides the regular mission collections, the music nights collected \$1026 to give to community action.

In July we collected backpacks, school supplies and money to give to GOMOC for going back to school. VBS also collected for this and we had a large number of supplies to donate. They were sooo thankful. Praising the Lord for His bounty,

In August we collected donations for Care-a-Van ministries in Batavia. This is our first time for this mission. If you see the little church driving around Batavia that is part of Care-a-Van. Their mission statement - The Care-a-Van vehicles and volunteers are the tools to bring prayer, compassion, love, hope, food and clothing to those in need. We collected \$983 to send to them.

We have many missions that we support - world, nation and community. The Lord tells us to go into the world to preach the good news, many of us don't go very far from our homes. So, we need to support the people that do go out to do the work of the Lord.

The mission for Sept. is a community mission Hands for Hope. Their mission statement is to serve as God's "Hands" in the streets, "Sharing" the love and grace of Jesus Christ to reflect His Glory. We provide nutritional food for the body as well as spiritual food for the soul. To let everyone know they are loved. We are also gathering gently used coats, scarves and gloves/mittens to give them to hand out.

Also in August we served the soup kitchen in Albion. We prepare and provide the food that is served that night, we served 371 meals August 31. They take 177 meals out into the community after the meal is served at the church.

We are collecting items to fill the shoe boxes in October. Alice Mathes and the education dept. head up this mission which is part of Samaritan's purse which is through the Billy Graham Evangelistic Association. They put school supplies in the boxes, small toys (no Guns or knives), wash clothes or small towels, t-shirts and small flashlights to name a few things. Please no candy, toothpaste or liquids. We have shoe boxes if you would like to fill a box or two or three of your own. Please do not wrap the box, they will unwrap it to check to see there is nothing in them that shouldn't be there

We are all well blessed so let's pass it on.
